Choose Your Program

Unless otherwise noted, all program topics are available at the Aviary, at your facility, or virtually.

Preschool & Kindergarten

These interactive programs can be held at the National Aviary or at your school unless noted.

• Nature's Diner (30 minutes)

Through puppets, props, and a visit from an Animal Ambassador, National Aviary educators introduce children to different birds, their foods, and how different types of birds use their beaks to eat.

• Rainbows in Flight (30 minutes)

Discover how important colors are to the animal world by exploring the huge variety in feathers—from the bright colors of a parrot to the muted camouflage of an owl. Meet a live bird ambassador and learn how its coloration helps it to survive and thrive in its own special way.

Elementary School (Grades 1-5)

These interactive programs can be held at the National Aviary or at your school unless noted.

Amazing Adaptations: Elementary Format

(45 minutes)

Birds are equipped with traits that help them survive in their natural habitats. Students discover what these unique characteristics are and explore amazing feet, feathers, and beaks!

Habitats (45 minutes)

From the frigid arctic to arid deserts, birds can be found in nearly every habitat on Earth! Learn what an animal needs to survive in different habitats and how birds can thrive in even the most extreme environments.

• **Owls** (45 minutes)

Owls are some of the most recognizable birds on earth, yet they remain elusive to many because of their habits and behaviors. Learn about the diversity of this remarkable group across the globe and close to home and discover the amazing adaptations that make them successful hunters, day and night!

• Rainforests (45 minutes)

Discover rainforest habitats through the eyes of the birds who live there. Students examine how rainforests, home to nearly half the world's plant and animal species, support ecological balance and why they are so important to protect.

A Teachers Guide to the Aviary: Habitat Designers This STEELS-aligned activity guide provides resources for before, during, and after your field trip that help students learn about what makes a healthy habitat. They will explore

habitats at the National Aviary, investigate how each habitat meets the needs of the different birds that live there, then try designing their own!

NEW! Wings around the World School Partnership

During this multi-touchpoint experience for 1st-3rd graders, students will gain in-depth knowledge about birds close to home and around the globe during two classroom visits. They will develop an appreciation for birds right in their backyard with a provided schoolyard bird feeder and a bird identification guide, given during the first classroom visit. After gaining an understanding of the bird world, students will take a field trip to the Aviary, where they will get an up close look and understanding of the importance of birds to our shared environment, the conservation challenges they face, and how we can help them (and ourselves!). This comprehensive field trip includes a thought-provoking education program, exploration of Aviary habitats, and the thrill of a live immersive bird show.



Middle School (Grades 6-8)

These interactive programs can be held at the National Aviary or at your school unless noted.

Habitats: Middle School Format (45 minutes)

From the frigid arctic to arid deserts birds can be found in nearly every habitat on Earth! Learn what an animal needs to survive in different habitats, and how birds can thrive in even the most extreme environments.

Birds and Conservation: Middle School Format (45 minutes)

Explore the impacts humans and environmental factors have on the decline of various species, and discover how the conservation efforts of zoos, scientists, and everyday community members have led once-endangered species to make a comeback.

• NEW! Avian Adaptations: A Spectrum of Structure and Color (45 minutes)

The Avian world is full of color, even beyond what the human eye can see. From feather pigments to avian eyesight, students will explore how this colorful spectrum helps birds to survive, find food, attract mates, and more.

• A Teachers Guide to the Aviary: Super Sleuths!

Can your students identify the mystery bird? While they investigate the mysterious identity of an unknown bird, students will discover the various adaptations that make birds unique in the animal kingdom. This STEELS-aligned activity guide provides resources for before, during, and after your field trip that help support and extend student learning. (Offered at the National Aviary only)



High School (Grades 9-12)

These interactive programs can be held at the National Aviary or at your school unless noted.

Zoo Careers (45 minutes)

Do your students wonder what it's like to be a zoo veterinarian? What about a zookeeper? What other career opportunities are there at zoos? In this program we'll explore some of the tools of the trade and learn all about zoo careers and what it takes to work in a zoo environment.

Science and Animal Behavior (45 minutes)

How do scientists study birds? Students will implement the same methods and data collection techniques that ornithologists use. Your group will watch the birds and animals who live in the National Aviary's immersive, free-flight habitats and complete ethograms on what they see. A combination of classroom activities and independent observation work encourages students to think like scientists. (Offered at the National Aviary only for groups of 35 or under)

The National Aviary Education Program schedule fills up fast! To ensure the greatest availability, we recommend contacting us to register **at least 6 weeks in advance** of your program or visit. To allow time to process your request, we require a **minimum of 2 weeks' advance notice** to schedule your outreach program or to visit the Aviary.

- 2. A member of our Education Programs team will contact you after receipt of your completed inquiry to confirm the details of your reservation and to answer any questions you may have.
- 3. A field trip agreement will be emailed for you to review and sign.
- **4.** Return the signed agreement to finalize your reservation.
- 5. Your final count of students and adults along with payment are due at least two weeks prior to the scheduled program or visit. Payment is non-refundable.
- 6. Please contact us by phone or email if you have questions at any point in the registration process. We are happy to help you!







National Aviary Chaperone Requirements

Preschool and Kindergarten groups: 1 adult chaperone for every 5 children.

1st-12th grade: 1 adult chaperone for every 10 students.

These chaperones, along with the bus driver, receive complimentary admission. If your organization requires a higher chaperone to student ratio, please plan your visit in accordance with that policy. Chaperones must remain with their groups at all times during your National Aviary visit. To ensure a safe and fun visit for all National Aviary guests, all members of your party must follow National Aviary Guest Policies as outlined on our website https://www.aviary.org/about-us/guest-policies-faqs/.

Outreach Guidelines

To ensure the safety and wellbeing of our animals and of your participants, please plan to provide the following for the Outreach team:

- A legal parking space close to the entrance of your facility
- A safe holding area for birds before and during the program, sufficiently sheltered from direct sunlight and weather
- A presentation space with no moving ceiling fans, balloons, objects hanging from the ceiling, or other animals, a 6'-8' table, and a secure stage area that prevents people from walking behind the birds & our educators
- Chaperones in accordance with your organization's policies, and at minimum of one adult for every 25 children

Group Visit Requirements

To qualify for the discounted group rate, the minimum group size for field trips and other groups is 15 paying participants. All members of your group must arrive at the same time.

Payment

To qualify for the discounted group rate, a final count and full payment must be received at least 2 weeks in advance of your program or visit date. Your organization will be charged for the number of people indicated on the invoice by this deadline. If payment is not received, your reservation is subject to cancellation or rescheduling. A member of our team will verify the number of people in your group upon arrival. Any members of your group in excess of the final count are welcome to purchase regular price individual tickets at our Visitor Services Desk. Refunds are not provided if actual attendance is lower than indicated in your final count. Thank you for your support of the National Aviary!
